

Three in One Breed Show – RULES 2012
ALL EXHIBITORS/ TRAINERS – PLEASE READ ALL RULES CAREFULLY

STALL POLICIES

- Horses may be moved into stalls any time after 12:00 noon on Thursday, July 5th, 2012. **NO EARLY ARRIVALS PLEASE WITHOUT FIRST CALLING SHOW SECRETARY FOR APPROVAL.**
- If staying over on Sunday evening, all stalls must be vacated by 10:00 AM sharp, Monday July 9th
- Alley ways to remain clear. No use of empty stalls for storage, temporary usage, day usage without payment to the Show Secretary.
- Stalls must be **booked and paid** by June 25th, 2012 at a cost of \$20.00 per day/per stall.
- Stalls are booked on a first come first serve basis and must be booked in the name of the party responsible for the payment of the stalls.
- Exhibitors who wish to be stabled together must reserve their stalls under the name of the exhibitor/owner.
- A separate stall cleanout deposit in the amount of \$50.00 (per reserved stall) must accompany entry form. Refundable upon inspection by the stable manager that your stall has been cleaned out.
- Show Management will attempt to stable together those exhibitors that indicate their wish on their stall reservation, but management reserves the right to allocate stalls as required and does not guarantee stall placements.
- Stalls will be labeled on Thursday, July 5th in advance of exhibitor arrival.

MEMBERSHIPS

- Show management must inspect breed membership cards or a photocopy. If the exhibitor cannot produce a valid/current membership card or a photocopy, they must purchase a new membership and pay the required fee before entering. This fee is non-refundable.

REGISTRATION PAPERS

- A photocopy of registration papers must be attached with all entry forms or be provided to the show office prior to entering.

ENTRIES

- All fees associated with entering classes must accompany the entry form
- Youth and Novice Youth class fees are \$8.00/judge (\$16.00 per class/double judged)
- A weekend rate for Youth and Novice Youth classes will be \$100.00
- Novice Amateur, Amateur and Amateur Select class fees are \$11.00/judge (\$22.00 per class/double judged)
- A weekend rate for Novice Amateur, Amateur and Amateur Select classes will be \$120.00
- A weekend rate for APHA Breeding Stock Amateur classes will be \$65.00
- Jr. Horse, Sr. Horse or Open All ages, Solid Paint Breeding Stock Open classes, will be \$11.00/judge (\$22.00 per class/double judged)
- A weekend rate for Jr. Horse, Sr. Horse or Open All ages, Solid Paint Breeding Stock Open classes will be \$80.00
- Office Administration Fee.....\$25.00
- AQHA Breed Association fees/BCQHA Drug Testing Levy and Hi Pt Levy and BCQHA Approval, NBCQHA Hi-Pt Award fees and Provincial Hi-Pt Award fees....\$17.50/horse/judge (\$35.00 total)
- APHA Breed Association/Drug Testing Levy and Hi Pt Levy....\$12.50/horse/judge (\$25.00 total - \$4.00 of which are APHA Filing fees for 2 judges)
- ApHCC Breed Association Fees.\$7.50/horse/judge (\$15.00 total)
- Stabling Fee.....\$20.00 per day
- Stall Cleanout Deposit.....\$50.00 (separate cheque made to 3 in 1 Breed Show, will be returned if your stall is cleaned out at end of show)
- Camping Fee.....\$10.00
- Electrical Plug in Fee.....\$10.00
- Barbeque Tickets.....\$12.00 per person

- **All fees are to be paid in Canadian funds. We do not accept Visa or Mastercard, however accept email money transfer and Paypal (which allows credit card payment). Email Show secretary for details barb@designbylonesomepine.com**
MAKE ALL CHEQUES PAYABLE TO THE: 3 IN 1 BREED SHOW
- **NSF Cheques:** There will be a \$50.00 charge for all NSF cheques
- **Refunds:** Will be made to exhibitors who present a copy of a Veterinarians or Doctor's Certificate before the show starts

- **Due to a shortage of office staff, full pre-entry is encouraged. Any and all All Post Entries at the show grounds will be charged a one time Post entry fee of \$30.00 regardless of pre-entry.**

- Classes may be post entered at the show office for the fees noted above, but all accounts must be settled before awards will be received.
- There will be no admittance into a class at the gate without office verification of a paid entry in that class.

REGISTERED BREED CLASSES

- All classes will be run under the current rules and regulations of the breed association class in which the exhibitor has entered.
- Show management reserves the right to combine Jr and Sr horse classes to ensure sufficient entries for point classes upon consultation with the judge and exhibitors in those classes, or as per applicable Association rule book.
- Amateur Select classes will be combined with amateur if less than 3 exhibitors in the class as per association rules, however results for those select exhibitors in combined classes will contribute towards their Hi Pt Award, as appropriate.
- All classes will be subject to cancellation, to be determined by show management for insufficient entries.
- Gate Holds – will not be permitted without show management permission
- Breaks – are indicated in the program but may change at the discretion of show management. All changes will be announced
- APHA and ApHCC “Most Colorful” classes will not count towards High Point Awards.

OPEN AND STAKE CLASSES

- Open classes will be run under the rules and regulations of the American Quarter Horse Association for judging purposes
- Open/stake Classes are open to any breed, registered or non-registered horse/rider combinations, unless if specified as non-pro.
- All Open Classes will be single judged and will not qualify for breed association points.
- Open/stake all breed classes, excluding warmup classes, are APHA PAC approved classes.
- Stake Class entry fee (\$50.00) will consist of a \$10.00 administration fee (retained by office) with the balance of the total fees collected paid out to the maximum of first three placings in the class, as follows:

- Open Classes at the 2012 Three in One Breed Show will be:
 1. **Never Won a Buckle – Non Pro Reining Class - \$50.00 entry fee**
 - a. Class is reserved for a horse/rider combination who has never won a reining buckle
 - b. A non-pro shall be defined as any person, regardless of age, who is not currently receiving remuneration directly or indirectly for showing, training, giving lessons, clinics or assisting in the training of a horse.
 - c. Two handed (optional)
 - d. In the event of a tie, a run-off will be required
 - e. Buckle will be awarded for a first placing only
 - f. Modified Pattern – no lead changes
 2. **Warm Up Trail**
 - a. This class will be for warm up purposes only and will not be judged. This class will run during the Saturday lunch break depending on number of entries. This class is limited to a maximum of 12 entries, so be sure to get your entry in early. Times will be posted on Friday 6:00pm (please be on time). The hour will be broken into 4-15 minute segments. Each segment will allow 3 horse/rider groups to practice on the obstacles for a maximum of 15 minutes regardless of what obstacles are chosen to be worked. If time permits and interest to enter this class is high, the class will be extended an additional 30 minutes to accommodate 6 more riders at the discretion of show management.
 3. **Warm Up Hunter Under Saddle**
 - a. This class will be for warm up purposes only and will not be judged. Horses will be asked to work both ways of the ring at all 3 gaits.

4. **Warm Up Western Pleasure**
 - a. This class will be for warm up purposes only and will not be judged. Horses will be asked to work both ways of the ring at all 3 gaits.

5. **Tiny Tots Leadline**
 - a. Limited to youth 12 yrs as of January 1, 2012 or under.
 - b. Class is free to enter
 - c. No cross entries for exhibitor in any other riding class

6. **In Hand Challenge – Entry fee - \$50.00 for all 3 classes included.**
 - a. Open to any exhibitor / horse combination. Non Pros only are eligible for this Challenge.
 - b. Classes will be judged under AQHA Showmanship, halter Judging Guidelines, and APHA lungeline guidelines.
 - c. Exhibitors must compete in all 3 challenge classes based on their horse's sex, Class #121 or 122 or 133, 124 and 125
 - d. Prizes will be awarded to the top 3 that have accumulated the highest point scores over the 3 class challenges, Halter, Showmanship and Lunge Line.

7. **Open All Breed Freestyle Reining Class**
 - a. Reining maneuvers originated from moves that a cow horse must use in performing its duties and have been refined to the high level of competition existing today.
 - b. Freestyle Reining not only provides an opportunity to use these maneuvers creatively, but also to expand them to music by means of choreography. Riders are encouraged to use musical scores which permit them to show the athletic ability of the horse in a crowd appealing way.
 - c. NRHA rules will apply except where the following rules pre-empt same.
 - d. Required Maneuvers. Will be defined as follows:
 - i. A minimum of 4 consecutive spins to the right
 - ii. A minimum of 4 consecutive spins to the left
 - iii. A minimum of 3 stops
 - iv. A minimum of 1 lead change from right to left (Flying or simple; extra credit will be awarded for flying changes).
 - v. A minimum of 1 lead change from left to right (Flying or simple; extra credit will be awarded for flying changes).
 - e. Exhibitors will only be judged astride.
 - f. Exhibitors are allowed to use two hands (as well as one or no hands) and any bit approved by the NRHA Handbook, including snaffle bits and bosals approved for use in the Snaffle Bit or Hackamore classes.
 - g. Failure to perform all the required maneuvers or failure to complete the performance within the time limit will result in a score of 0.
 - h. Additional maneuvers such as rollbacks, backups, speed variations, and non-classical reining maneuvers such as half pass and side pass are appropriate in Freestyle and shall be given appropriate credit. Additional repetitions
 - i. of required maneuvers are appropriate, but will only add or subtract from the existing scores already given for the required maneuvers, not as additional scores.
 - j. Equipment used in Freestyle must adhere to the following standards:
 - i. All equipment must be non-abusive and humane based on NRHA Rules and Guidelines.
 - ii. Any equipment not specifically covered by or in conflict with standard equipment guidelines must be non-abusive to the horse.
 - k. Time Limit. A maximum of 4 minutes including any introductions. The time limit will be from the beginning of the music or from the beginning of the introduction (whichever is first) and will end with the music.
 - l. Costumes. Permitted but not required.
 - m. Emphasis is placed on performing the reining maneuvers to music.
 - n. Props. Permitted but at no time may hinder the judges' view of the horse. The use of props will not add to the score.

TRAIL CLASSES

- Exhibitors may not enter the ring during or after the set up of the course. A Warm Up trail class on Saturday

will be provided for practice. It will run during lunch hour for approx 1 – 1.5 hours depending on the number of entries. Entries will be limited, please enter early to reserve your spot. Refer to the Open Entry form to submit your fee for this class should you wish to utilize it.

AWARDS – DIVISION HI POINT AND RESERVE HI POINT

- **TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR HI PT AWARDS, EXHIBITORS MUST DECLARE THEIR DESIRE TO PARTICIPATE BY CHECKING THE APPROPRIATE BOX ON THE ENTRY FORMS OR BY DECLARING AT THE SHOW OFFICE BEFORE FRIDAY JULY 6TH, 9:00PM.**
- All Awards for the Three in One Breed Show will be presented 1 hour after the final class of the show unless otherwise announced by show committee.
- To be eligible for a hi-point awards, competitors must compete in a minimum of the following classes of the division they are competing; 1 Halter (showmanship or halter), Trail, 1 Western class (Western Pleasure or Western Horsemanship), 1 English Class (Hunter Under Saddle or Hunt Seat Equitation) and Reining. Amateurs can meet their Reining requirement by entering their breed's Open Reining class. Weekend rates will include the reining class that is required to qualify for the high point in the division chosen.
- APHA and APHCC "Most Colorful" Classes will not be eligible as a halter class when compiling points towards a Hi-Pt. Award.
- Hi-Point Buckle Awards will be presented to the following divisions;
 - **APHA** - Amateur Division ~ Solid Paint Bred ~ Open Division ~ Youth Division
 - **APHCC** – Amateur Division ~ Open Division ~ Youth Division
 - **AQHA** – Novice Amateur Division ~ Amateur Division ~ Amateur Select Division ~ Junior Horse Division ~ Senior Horse Division ~ Youth Division ~ Novice Youth Division
- Prizes will be awarded to the Hi Point and Reserve APHA Amateur Solid Paint Bred
- Points for all of the Breed Association's Hi-Pt. Awards are based on the following:

TIES

- **Ties will be broken by choosing the exhibitor with the most 1st places over the other tied exhibitor. If a tie still exists, then the exhibitor with the most 2nd places will be deemed the winner.**

DRUG TESTING

- All classes sanctioned by the Three in One Breed Show may be subject to drug testing and will comply with breed association rules and regulations

UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT AND/OR INHUMANE TREATMENT

- When an exhibitor, owner and/or his representative, acting on behalf of the exhibitor is guilty of unsportsmanlike conduct and/or inhumane treatment of a horse while on the show grounds, the show management, at its sole discretion, may suspend such individual(s) from competition and a report will be forwarded to its breed association. No refund of entry fee will be made.

YOUTH

- It is strongly recommended that youth wear ASTM/SEI approved helmets when competing in under saddle events. Where helmets are worn by youth, doing so will not count against them.

GENERAL

- **Camping:** camping is permitted at a flat rate of \$10.00 for the show weekend. There are no designated locations for camping. Exhibitors camping on the show grounds are asked to choose camping locations that do not interfere with the flow of regular traffic and access to the show arenas by exhibitors and their horses. Please do not use or position yourself near Electrical plugins unless you have paid for the use of one on your entry form.
- **Horse Manure:** hay and shavings around stalls and from trailers or camper must be removed and properly disposed in manure bins.

DAMAGES OR LOSSES

- The Three in One Breed Show Management and Show Committee will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be the condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show management blameless for any loss or accident to his horse or horse equipment which may occur from accident, sickness, fire or otherwise. All owners and exhibitors will be responsible for any damage incurred by them or their agents to the barns or properties on the show grounds and will be billed accordingly.

RELEASE FORM

- The release form on the back of the entry form must be read and signed before showing

DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- Any exhibitor making objection to the awarding of any of the prizes or payouts, shall lodge his or her objection, in writing, using the Dispute Form available at the show office, immediately after the award is made. A deposit of \$25.00 must accompany the objection, which is refundable, if the objection is upheld.
- Should any question or dispute arise, which is not provided for in the foregoing rules, the same shall be referred to the show manager who will consult with the show committee, whose decision shall be final.
